U.S. colleges and universities can apply to host native speakers of critical languages as teaching assistants at their institutions.

Program for the Study of Eastern Europe and the Independent States of the Former Soviet Union (Title VIII)

Provides grants to universities and institutions of higher education. These institutions, in turn, provide U.S. citizen scholars and students funding for research and foreign-language training related to Eastern and Central Europe and Eurasia.
